Safety Plan

Overall Guidelines and Protocols

Summary of guidelines we will implement to adhere to the health and safety guidelines:

- New Image College will take into consideration how many students are allowed at one time in the facility. Please follow the guidelines attached to every door on the maximum occupancy number.
- Students and staff are subject to mandatory temperature checks upon entry and may be subject to various times within the facility. If there is a fever, students and staff will be asked to exit the facility immediately.
- All staff, instructors, and students in Personal Services classes (Makeup, Spa, and Nails) will be provided with Face Shields. These must be worn at all times when performing services.
- All staff, instructors, students, and guests are asked to wear non-medical face masks upon entry.
- Gloves are available for staff, instructors, and students in Nails and Spa programs.
- All student stations and desks have been separated by 2 metres.
- Regular and consistent cleaning using “virucidal” agents for effective sanitation in the school and surfaces. There is continued increased deep cleaning and sanitization of classrooms, washrooms, offices, and facilities.
- Protective barriers have been installed at the front desk, offices, and nail stations.
- Signage, directional arrows, and decals have been placed on-site to control traffic flow and to facilitate physical distancing. Stairwells and hallways must allow social distancing.
- To protect each class, by creating a “class bubble”, class schedules have been changed to reduce or eliminate classroom rotation. We are not inviting external guests at this time (i.e.: models)
- To reduce infection, all student lounges are not available for students.
- The student’s kitchen area is not available at this time (microwave, fridge, etc).
- Breaks and lunches must be taken offsite.
- Entry and exit times allowing for staggered use of public transportation and pedestrian arrival and departures from schools. Student capacity onsite is adjusted with certain courses,

modules, and levels by combining onsite learning with distance learning. Students are only to be at school during allotted times to maintain a low building density.

- Students must keep 2m distance from each whenever possible. Masks must be worn at all times. The entrance is the same for the Granville Campus.
- Once in, please use hand sanitizer/ visit a washing hand station and then head directly to your classes.
- No congregating is allowed. It is imperative to maintain social distancing. Always respect the 2m guideline and avoid any physical contact such as handshaking, hugging, fist-bumping.
- Personal classes instructors are competent in up-to-date, infection prevention protocols.
- Zero tolerance for any illness symptoms. If you re not feeling well, please stay home and contact the school immediately. Please see the sickness policy below.
- No stationery, kits, products, food, etc. to be exchanged between students and front desk/instructors.

Students Responsibilities

- Stay home if you are not feeling well (please see the sickness policy)
- Protect yourself and others from the spread COVID-19.
- Wear a mask and conduct a health assessment daily.
- Regularly and thoroughly clean your hands with an alcohol-based hand rub or wash them with soap and water.
- Make sure you, and the people around you, follow good respiratory hygiene. This means covering your mouth and nose with your bent elbow or tissue when you cough or sneeze. Then dispose of the used tissue immediately and wash your hands.
- Avoid touching eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Stay home and self-isolate even with minor symptoms such as cough, headache, mild fever, until you recover. Notify the school immediately.
- Be aware of your own family's circumstances and risks.
- Always maintain social distance.
- Avoid going to crowded places.
- Check travel and public health advisories as this is an evolving situation.
- International Students arriving in Canada must have a plan in place to self-isolate for 14 days before joining the community.
- Notify all guests of our policies and procedures.

Sickness Policy

Stay Home When Required to Self-Isolate

The following students or staff must stay home and self-isolate:

- A person confirmed by public health as a case of COVID-19; or
- A person confirmed by public health as a close contact of a confirmed case or outbreak of COVID-19; or
- A person who has travelled outside of Canada in the last 14 days.

Anyone required to self-isolate will be supported by public health. Additional information is available from BCCDC.

Stay Home When Sick

Staying home when sick is one of the most important ways to reduce the introduction to and the spread of COVID-19 in schools.

- Perform a daily health check.
- Stay at home when sick.
- Get a health assessment and/or COVID-19 test when sick.

These steps do not replace usual health care. Health questions can be directed to 8-1-1 or your health care provider.

Daily Health Check

Students and staff are required to perform a daily health check every day.

A daily health check is a tool to reduce the likelihood of a person with COVID-19 coming to school when they are infectious. Please perform a daily health check every day before coming to New Image College. The following is an example of a daily health check to determine if you should attend school that day.

If you answered "YES" to one of the questions included under section 1 (excluding fever)

- IF YOU ARE AT HOME: please refrain from coming to school. Stay home for 24 hours from when the symptom started. If the symptom improves, you may return to school the next day when you feel well enough. If the symptom persists or worsens, seek a health assessment.
- IF YOU ARE AT SCHOOL: if the symptom arises while you are in school, please gather all your personal belongings and check out at the front desk. Please leave New Image College for the

day and stay home for 24 hours from when the symptom started. If the symptom improves, you may return to school the next day when you feel well enough. If the symptom persists or worsens, seek a health assessment.

If you answered “YES” to two or more of the questions included under section 1 or you have a fever

- IF YOU ARE AT HOME: please refrain from coming to school and seek a health assessment.
- IF YOU ARE AT SCHOOL: if the symptom arises while you are in school, please gather all your personal belongings and check out at the front desk. Please leave New Image College and seek a health assessment.

What is a Health Assessment?

A health assessment includes

- calling 8-1-1,
or
- a primary care provider like a physician or nurse practitioner

If a health assessment is required, you should not return to school until COVID-19 has been excluded and your symptoms have improved.

When a COVID-19 test is recommended by the health assessment:

- If the COVID-19 test is positive, you should stay home until you are told by public health to end self-isolation. In most cases this is 10 days after the onset of symptoms. Public health will contact everyone with a positive test. Please notify the school immediately.
- If the COVID-19 test is negative, you can return to school once symptoms have improved and you feel well enough. Symptoms of common respiratory illnesses can persist for a week or more. Re-testing is not needed unless you develop a new illness. Please notify the school.
- If a COVID-19 test is recommended but is not done because you choose not to have the test, or you do not seek a health assessment when recommended, and your symptoms are not related to a previously diagnosed health condition, you should stay home from school until 10 days after the onset of symptoms, and then you may return if you are feeling well enough. Please notify the school.
- If a COVID-19 test is not recommended by the health assessment, you can return to school when symptoms improve, and you feel well enough. Testing may not be recommended if the assessment determines that the symptoms are due to another cause (i.e. not COVID-19). Please notify the school.

If you answered “YES” to questions 2 or 3, please note:

People who are coming from overseas or are contacts of a confirmed case, meaning they have been or could have been exposed to the virus but do not have symptoms are required to self-isolate for 14 days since their last contact with the positive person or as soon as they arrive to Canada and monitor for symptoms.

Self-isolation means staying home and avoiding situations where you could come in contact with others. You may have been exposed to the virus and are at risk for developing COVID-19 and passing it on to others. You should not self-isolate in a place where you will be in contact with vulnerable people, such as seniors and individuals with underlying health conditions.

Other considerations

Students or staff may still attend school if a member of their household develops new symptoms of illness, provided the student/staff has no symptoms themselves.

If the household member tests positive for COVID-19, public health will advise the asymptomatic student/staff on self-isolation and when they may return to school.

Most illness experienced in B.C. is not COVID-19, even if the symptoms are similar.

Students and staff who experience symptoms consistent with a previously diagnosed health condition can continue to attend school when they are experiencing these symptoms as normal. They do not require re-assessment by a healthcare provider and should not be required to provide a health-care provider note. If they experience any new or unexplained symptoms, they should seek assessment by a health-care provider

COVID-19 Testing

Testing is available for all who need it but not everyone requires a test. If you develop symptoms, use the BC COVID-19 Self-Assessment Tool to help determine if you need further assessment or testing for COVID-19. You can complete this assessment for yourself, or on behalf of someone else, if they are unable to.

Where to get a COVID-19 test

You can get a COVID-19 test from a physician, nurse practitioner, urgent and primary care centre or at a COVID-19 test collection centre. You can call 8-1-1 to find testing near you. Please visit an emergency department if you are experiencing health conditions that require urgent and emergency care.

Vancouver Coastal Health test collection centres and urgent and primary care centres (UPCC) that offer testing and assessment are listed below. Please be prepared to wait in line. Test collection centres may have faster wait times. To find the wait times for some of our sites, please visit our wait-times website.

Cleaning Policy

New Image College cleaning protocol will continue to focus on high-traffic areas and high-contact surfaces.

- **Adequate** handwashing and hand-sanitizing stations on site for all staff, faculty, and students and ensure the location is visible and easily accessed.
- Require all staff, faculty, students, and clients to apply good hand hygiene practice by washing or using hand sanitizer when they arrive at the school, before and after going on a break, after using the washroom, after handling any equipment that has come into contact with the public, before and after using masks and other personal protective equipment, before and after each service provided.
- Removed any unnecessary tools or equipment that may elevate the risk of transmission.
- Commonly used surfaces (countertops, barriers, desktops, and any staff room surfaces such as laundry machines, etc) are cleaned every 4 hours using standard surface cleaning protocols using a virucidal agent.
- High touch objects (doorknobs, handrails, lightswitches, cabinet handles, faucet handles, tables, countertops) cleaned regularly using standard surface cleaning protocols using a virucidal agent.
- General cleaning and disinfecting of the premises occurs once a day.
- Garbage containers are empty often (at least daily).
- Use of approved hard-surface disinfectants that have a Drug Identification Number (DIN) for cleaning.
- Manufacturer's instructions for safe use are ready and followed (e.g. wear gloves, use in a well-ventilated area, allow enough contact time for the disinfectant to kill germs based on the product being used).
- Products are selected based on the following list: <https://www.canada.ca/en/health-canada/services/drugs-health-products/disinfectants/covid-19/list.html>
- Cleaners' hands must be washed with soap and water or use alcohol-based hand sanitizer after removing gloves.
- Damp cleaning methods such as damp clean cloths and/or wet mop are used.
- Sweeping and dust are not allowed as this can distribute virus droplets into the air.
- Reusable cleaning items can be washed using regular laundry soap and hot water (60-90 C).

- Posted signage with best hygiene/hand washing practices.
- For the Nails and Spa classes, Barbicide, CS20, and Virolex will be used. These are disinfectants for cleaning implements and tools.

Physical Distance Policy

- Always observe the new normal with personal introductions: no handshakes, no hugs.
- No visitors, models, and clients coming to the campus, unless previously scheduled.
- Removed extra furniture to provide more space in classrooms and higher traffic flow areas.
- Classrooms to observe physical distancing measures and maximum occupancy limits.
- Posted signage for traffic management.
- Rearranged class layouts, class schedules, curriculum content, and course delivery to observe infection control measures.
- “Classroom bubbles” so that students minimize rotation between classes and stay with their same classmates and move through each module/level/course and their program together.
- Front desk, offices, and nail stations have plexiglass shields installed.
- Workstations have been separated by a minimum of 2 metres.
- All personal services programs’ students, faculty, and staff in all programs are provided with a face shield.

Communication Policy

- New Image College will require staff, faculty, students, and clients to follow the policies and guidelines regarding COVID-19 to reduce the risk of transmission.
- These requirements will be posted in the applicable areas within our facilities, emailed to students, instructors, and staff before returning to the classroom or starting a new program.
- We will continue to assess the campus after operations resume to ensure risks are identified and managed. We will monitor and update our Safety Plan as new information and updates become available.

Refuse to Entry Policy

- New Image College reserve the right to refuse entry of any student, client, staff, and faculty that is not observing the protocols and guidelines and enforce any appropriate penalties.

Visitor Policy

This policy applies to any visitor/guest to New Image College including but not limited to admission appointments.

Before you arrive

1. Our new policy always requires you to wear a face mask while inside New Image College facility. Please bring a personal mask from home with elastics that go around your ears. If you do not agree to wear a mask at all times, we have the right to refuse entry.
2. Arrive in clean clothing, with only your personal device and form of cashless payment, is applicable.
3. Arrive no more than five minutes before your booked appointment, as designated waiting areas will no longer be available. You will be asked to wait outside until your allocated time.
4. Attend appointments alone. Friends, family members, children and/or pets will be asked to stay at home
5. Bookings are to be done based on the maintenance of physical distancing. No walk-ins.
6. New Image College has taken extra precautions and has put more rigorous cleaning measures with additional sanitation procedures and protocols.

When you arrive

1. You will be asked to confirm if you are feeling well – no fever, cough, or difficulty breathing. You will be asked to fill up a Screening Questionnaire.
2. Expect to have your temperature taken upon entering the location. We will use a contactless, infrared thermometer to check the temperature of every guest. Any guest with a temperature above 99°F will be sent home, advised to seek medical attention, and welcomed to return to the location when a fever and symptoms of COVID-19 no longer exist.
3. Please disinfect your hands upon arrival, using the restrooms and/or sanitation stations provided. It is advised to wash hands with clean water for a minimum of 20 seconds.
4. Outside food and/or drinks will not be permitted in the facility.

Reopen Plan New Image College

Introduction

New Image College following the guidelines provided by Health Authorities orders. New Image College aims to support the provincial government's goal of breaking the chains of transmission of COVID-19 among people in British Columbia.

Resuming in-class instruction

As we look forward to the resumption of in-class instruction on a hybrid schedule that mixes both onsite training, as well as distance learning, student and staff health and safety, remain our top priority.

To accommodate health and safety measures, including physical distancing and reducing physical contact, classes' schedules and breaks will be staggered to accommodate our group sizes at any one time.

Most of the program delivery will be onsite learning, supplemented by online support and virtual classes as needed.

Students who are not scheduled to attend a class should not be in the school unless arrangements have been made with a teacher.

Personal Service Classes

Our plan encompasses a wide range of classes, including:

- Esthetics: skin care services such as facials, wraps, massage, etc.
- Nails: manicures, pedicures, polish application, and artificial nail extensions
- Hair removal: waxing, threading, and sugaring.
- Lashes: artificial lash extensions
- Makeup: makeup application

Overall

- Follow enhanced Personal Service Guidelines and protocols for our Personal Services programs.
- Implemented requirements for instructors and students to wear Personal Protective Equipment (gloves – nails -, non-medical face masks, and face shields) when demonstrating/performing a service.
- Instructors and students may wear their masks that must be clean and laundered for each day of class.
- Clients for NIC Spa services will also be required to wear a mask. No walk-ins.
- All Spa, Nails, and Makeup Instructors have completed the BeautySafe Course, providing them with Certification on the necessary protocols and best practices for sanitation, disinfection, and sterilization. Personal Classes Instructors have extensive knowledge of infection control practices. These are a core component of the respective program's curriculum.

- Students in programs that provide Personal Services are provided with their Professional Kits. These kits contain their professional tools, implements, and products. There is no sharing of items with other students.
- New Image College will provide cleaning services for all common and interior areas but is also the responsibility of each student to abide by the sanitation guidelines when it comes to their workstations and products.
- Nails and Spa students will be assigned partners who will work consistently on each other only to minimize contact.
- Makeup students who need practice with different face shapes and skin tones will be grouped to minimize contact.
- DO NOT come to school if you are experiencing any illness symptoms. This is a zero-tolerance policy.

Hand Washing/Sanitizing

- When you arrive at the school
- Before and after going on a break
- After using the washroom
- After handling any equipment that has come into contact with the public
- Before and after handling shared tools and equipment
- Before and after using masks and other personal protective equipment
- Before and after each service.

Workstations

- Clean and disinfect all non-porous implements used in your services, as required (immersion, spray or wipe)
- Store properly disinfected implements in closed, containers that have also been disinfected (wipe or spray)
- Clean and disinfect all electrical implements used in your services as required
- Clean countertops
- Clean and disinfect chairs
 - Remember that porous materials cannot be disinfected and ongoing use of disinfectants on materials covering chairs can damage the material
 - On initial opening, feel free to disinfect your chairs, but limit that to once-daily – consider barrier methods on chairs such as disposable paper drapes or towels that can be laundered after each client
- Clean and disinfect station, rolling carts, drawers and any containers used for storage

- Ensure that single use (porous items) are new
- All items on a nail station must either be new, never used or cleaned and disinfected (stored in a closed container until ready to use)

Treatment Rooms

- Clean and disinfect any appliances used
- Clean and disinfect treatment tables
 - Remember that porous materials cannot be disinfected and ongoing use of disinfectants on materials covering tables can damage the material – consider barrier methods on chairs such as disposable paper drapes or towels that can be laundered after each client
- Ensure that all product to be used has not been contaminated by improper removal of the product before closure
- Ensure all single-use items are new
- Empty wax pots, completely clean and disinfect – refill with new wax
- Ensure that multi-use product containers have adequate single-use applicators available to safely remove product without contaminating the remaining product

Tools and equipment

- Minimize the sharing of tools, equipment, and product.
- No shared product. Each student will be given a kit, if applicable and they must use that only.
- Use single-use items, such as single-use make-up applicators if possible, and discard immediately these after use
- Isolate tools per client at a station
- Tools and brushes must be cleaned with 99% alcohol or Dawn Antibacterial Soap, then dunked in 70% alcohol to disinfect.
- Makeup students must bring and use their own cape + towel and use on themselves only.
- Disinfect
 - Blow dryer casing
 - Metal cups, spatula and palette
 - Bobby pins
 - Bristle brushes
 - Brushes
 - Clippers
 - Clips
 - Colour brushes, bottles, & bowls
 - Combs
 - Foiling boards

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

Masks: Masks must be supplied by the student and be worn as a safety measure.

Face Shields: Provided by New Image College. Must be worn when providing services.

Gloves: It is not a recommendation to require gloves. It is recommended that students adhere to rules regarding handwashing after and before each service/practice.

There are two exceptions where gloves are recommended – nail services and facial services. Gloves are to be worn for only a single service and hands washed thoroughly after they are removed. Gloves will be provided by New Image College.

Barriers: Physical barrier implemented for manicure services where the client may extend hands through cut out at table level.

Laundry

- Freshly laundered towels (according to hygiene protocols) to all services that a towel is required.
- Used towels must be removed immediately and stored in plastic bags to be laundered.
- There should be no moisture or dampness in any linen
- Launder (porous) or disinfect (non-porous) all capes
- All linens should be stored in closed, covered cabinets until used

Overall

- Follow all Overall Guidelines and Protocols
- DO NOT come to school if you are experiencing any illness symptoms. This is a zero-tolerance policy.

Hand Washing/Sanitizing

- When you arrive at the school
- Before and after going on a break
- After using the washroom
- After handling any equipment that has come into contact with the public
- Before and after using masks and other personal protective equipment

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

Masks: Masks must be supplied by the student and be worn as a safety measure.

Face shields: as needed.

Theatre/Plays

- Entrances and exits are regularly reviewed to ensure that individuals are not able to go in or out any other way.
- If and when we have an audience, all must abide by social distancing placement of chair and abide by the occupancy number of the theatre.
- Record keeping such as personal information and personal health information will be collected, used, stored, and communicated that may assist with any necessary contact tracing.

Props and Wardrobe

- Props and other items that are being handled must be wiped down/disinfected before and after use.
- Wardrobe must be bagged separately by performer and placed in the labeled rack.
- Wardrobe information will be provided as far in advance as possible to permit performers, including background performers, to wear their own clothing.
- Props and wardrobe pieces must be marked by the group presentation it belongs to and placed separated from the rest inside
- Props and wardrobe must be disinfected/quarantined/laundered before being returned to storage to avoid contamination.
- Performers must hand wash/sanitize hands before and after handling props.

- Each production must have an individual appointed to be responsible for these procedures.

Styling

- If possible, performers being styled should wear an appropriate face covering.
- Persons who provide hair and make-up services must wear appropriate personal protective equipment (e.g. surgical/procedure mask and face shield).
- Stylists/artists working directly on performers should wash or sanitize their hands before and after working on the performer and must wear appropriate personal protective equipment.
- If gloves are utilized, gloves should be changed between performers if working on multiple performers.
- Maintain physical distance to the extent possible which may include providing assisted styling for key cast only. Other options may include having performers do their own hair or makeup, including being directed by a stylist/artist from a distance, where appropriate and having performers remove their own makeup, where appropriate. Encourage performers to do what they can on their own before coming to the workplace (e.g. shaving) to shorten chair time.

Location/Studios

- Whenever possible, arrange for location to be outdoors, where possible, and weather permitting.
- Whenever possible, arrange for location to permit for 2 metre distancing and limit the individuals permitted to be in/around the location.
- Limit the number of camera workers with access to set while filming, particularly if filming in a small space.
- When selecting a location, the following will be considered:
 - the layout of the location with respect to the ability to monitor entrances and exits to ensure proper screening protocols can be maintained
 - the size of a location with respect to the ability to maintain physical distancing
 - the ability to have sufficient hand hygiene equipment readily available
 - whether the location provides for adequate ventilation
 - whether the location may require interaction with the public.
 - whether the location can be appropriately cleaned/disinfected before and after production work, as well as during the course of production at that location.
 - Locations that cannot be appropriately cleaned/disinfected should be avoided.
- In the case of private residences, whether they are currently occupied, and whether any occupants:
 - have been recently symptomatic or diagnosed with COVID-19.

- have travelled outside of Canada within the last 14 days.
- have been in contact with someone who has travelled outside of Canada within the last 14 days or who is known to have, or suspected of having, COVID-19.
- can vacate the residence at an appropriate time in advance of production work commencing in the residence.
- Before the start of shooting, mark areas for specific departments on set for equipment that is not currently being used by that department.

Equipment and Techs

- Whenever possible, the sharing of equipment between individuals should be avoided.
- Camera workers are not share kit pieces unless they have been appropriately disinfected between uses.
- Only authorized personnel handle camera equipment.
- Instruct individuals not to touch, move, lean against, pick up or otherwise disturb any piece of equipment/object that they are not required to handle.
- Equipment should be regularly disinfected.
- Performers should be wired by a technician wearing appropriate PPE.
- A boom to record sound will be preferred, when possible
- Techs must avoid “hand-offs” as much as possible by putting down items to be picked up by others
- Techs should be diligent with respect to handwashing/sanitizing, including washing or sanitizing hands before and after handling equipment, and throughout the day.
- Where the work requires close contact between technicians or between technicians and cast, a mask must be worn.

Performers

- Performers, including stand-ins, must wear personal protective equipment (e.g. face masks and shields) whenever possible.
- Clear barrier between performers should be placed, if possible.
- Any individuals who interact with a performer at less than two metres are required to wear a mask and face shield and to wash/sanitize hands.
- Limit all close proximity interactions that doesn't allow physical distance
- If performers touch one another during a scene, they are required to wash or sanitize their hands immediately before and after each take
